# President's Report

I want to start off by saying thank you. I knew from the start I had big shoes to fill, and that I had so much to learn in my first year as President. I am extremely grateful for the unwavering support I received from the Committee. I couldn't have done this or navigated through everything and still be here smiling without you.

Thank you to everyone who read my emails, responded to messages and answered my phone calls when I wanted to understand or clarify. My personal goal this season was to learn, and I tried to see as much as possible to increase my understanding of what happens and what you all do.

Thank you for sharing your time with me and giving me an insight into what you do to help our centre run so perfectly each week.

This season was also the start of something new. There were big changes with the LANSW/ANSW partnership and lots to understand on the athlete pathway progression and a few changes to events. The new Revsport platform opened up a new world of possibilities that allowed us to have an online uniform shop and athletes were able to book (and pay) for our holiday coaching clinics. Before our first night we broke our own record, we had 503 registrations this season, the largest number of registrations our centre has ever had, surpassing the previous record from 2000-01.

This season when reflecting was also a year of firsts. We had our first introduction night where our senior athletes volunteered their time to help our 11's learn triple jump and our 6's and 7's were introduced to shot put and discus. Thank you to our senior athletes for giving your time to help. We had a Coles Community Round and we were one of the lucky centres chosen to have Olympic high jumper, Brandon Starc come and visit. Brandon watched some of our high jumpers in action and was kind enough to give them a few tips and answer any questions. Brandon then joined our younger athletes and participated in the fruit relay with the trusted Coles baskets holding all the valuable fruit. RWLAC is now the proud owner of a huge pineapple photo prop, and I can't wait for the Coles Community Round again next season.

This season saw us invest in our athletes and we made some equipment purchases with our new high jump mats arriving during the September holidays. The grant (obtained in a previous season) for the sound system was delivered. The new sound system was installed towards the end of the season and all families (especially Luke) were pleased that all announcements are clear and can easily be heard.

This season was also a year of achievements. We had athletes who set and broke records, we have so many athletes who kept pushing and kept breaking their own PB's. We had athletes attend and represent RWLAC at State Relay, Zone Championiships, Regional Championship and State Championships. We celebrated their achievements, and we shared their disappointments when it simply wasn't their day.

One of my highlights when reflecting was the annual fun night. A chance, where we as a centre come together to farewell the athletes in the 17's who have finished as athletes at RWLAC. It is also an opportunity for all athletes, age managers and parents to spend time and laugh as we finish the season with some fun games.

My Friday nights are now free, I must admit it does seem a little strange to not be rushing off to Kelso. Looking back on the season that has been, I loved it. Some moments were tough and tested my resilience but overall, I'm proud of how the season ran. I loved being able to talk to more families, to welcome new families and build stronger relationships with those that returned.

I was asked a while ago what my favourite part of athletics was. I did at the time say, it was high jump (IoI) but now I realise that's not true. My favourite part about athletics and our centre is the people. The families and individuals who are our RWLAC community. I'm so lucky I had the opportunity to meet you and thank you for sharing so much with me during the season.

I'm coming back next season, and I really hope you are too!

RWLAC Annual Report 2024/2025

Looking back on the 2024/2025 season, we can all be incredibly proud of the achievements of our athletes and our centre as a whole. This season saw a vibrant new committee bring fresh ideas and passion to Revesby Workers' Little Athletics Centre. We welcomed a record 503 athletes to our centre who collectively achieved an impressive 5,132 Personal Best times & distances. In addition to 26 Centre records, 2 Region records and 1 Zone record broken!

The season was filled with memorable moments, from a visit form Santa and our final Fun Night where athletes and families enjoyed some relaxed fun, to our Coles Community Round, which included the unique opportunity for our athletes to experience professional training tips from Australian Olympian Brandon Starc as well as have a ton of fun.

Our achievements would not have been possible without the incredible support of our families and volunteers. From spiking and raking at field events, moving hurdles, stocking and running the BBQ and canteen, guiding young athletes between events, to the dedicated individuals who were there every week setting up and packing away equipment – a huge thank you to you all!

Our coaching team also invested countless volunteer hours, starting in the off-season, which undoubtedly contributed to the increased fantastic achievements of our athletes. This included **67 athletes** qualifying for the Region Championships and winning **43 medals**, and **25 athletes** qualifying for the State Championships and bringing home **10 medals**. This was truly our most successful season yet!

As the season has now come to a close, I want to express my sincere gratitude to our wonderful committee for their tireless volunteer hours outside of our Friday competition nights, who order stock for our canteen, coach athletes, update records, manage event helper rosters and are there every Friday night for set up and pack up as well as many many more tasks that needed to be done to keep it all going. Your support to our athletes and each other is invaluable. Thank you!

I look forward to seeing you all with more great achievements and experiences in the 2025/2026 Little Athletics season.

Hopefully the partnership between LANSW and ANSW will see more athletes continue competing once their time with RWLAC is finished.

This year we had great support from our parent volunteers on the circular track each Friday night. I thank all the parents who volunteered, often staying long after their children finished for the night. Special thanks must go to our former athlete and club vice captain Lily, who helped on circular track most weeks; Danijela, who is always one of the first to volunteer and goes above and beyond in her duties, as well as Laura and Leah, who were mainstays of our parent group. If I ever had to miss a week, I knew that things would run smoothly.

Finally, thanks to all the committee members who give so much of their time each week – setting up, packing away, running events and so many other duties behind the scenes, not just on Friday nights. Many of our committee do not have athletes competing, but still volunteer because they love the sport and love seeing the athletes having fun, making friends, and doing their best each week.

# Treasurer's Report

Revesby Workers' Little Athletics Centre maintained a solid financial position throughout the 2024/2025 season.

Various sources of revenue have contributed to this position:

This season had the highest number of athletes registered resulting in over \$37,000 in registration fees.

Revesby Workers' Club grant of \$12,000. The Club also passes sponsorship money from a portion of the amount RWLAC members spend at the Club. RWLAC greatly appreciates the Club's ongoing financial support and the interest shown by the Directors of the Club through their attendance at RWLAC functions. Our Liaison Director Christine is heavily involved in RWLAC and promotes a great relationship between RWLAC and the Club.

Hire of equipment to school carnivals at Kelso North. Thanks to Christine for liaising with the schools and organising the equipment for hire.

Platinum sponsors Clarke National Realty and Benedict Recycling each donating \$3,000. The monies were used to purchase a large marquee with RWLAC logo, table covers with RWLAC logo and tables.

Canterbury Bankstown Council grants for the purchase of a defibrillator and a new speaker system for the announcement room.

The canteen continues to be a steady source of revenue. Many thanks to Rebecca for her time and effort in organising the canteen.

Not only have the weekly coaching sessions and the holiday coaching clinics improved our athletes' skills, the sessions have also raised valuable funds for our athletes and centre.

Due to the demand for cashless transactions RWLAC obtained an EFTPOS machine for the canteen account. This enables the canteen sales to be deposited directly into the canteen account and makes it simpler to account for the general operating account.

The funds raised have been used to maintain existing equipment and purchase new equipment. Major purchases include the high jump mats, radio cupboard, speaker system and a new BBQ.

At the end of the 2024/2025 season RWLAC has a healthy bank balance. The funds will be used to ensure RWLAC is well equipped to run events for our athletes. The Committee is looking into a circular track starting system for next season.

On a personal note, this is my first year as treasurer. After Erin and I had to verify ourselves to the bank twice, things went smoothly. I'd like to thank Christine (previous President of RWLAC) for her guidance when I first took on the role and Erin for coming over on Wednesdays to make payments and meeting me at the bank to make withdrawals.

# Registrar's Report Siobhan Mackenzie & Glynis Warner



The 2024/2025 season registrations proved successful yet again, with another increase in our number of registered athletes from last season. With 503 athletes registering, this was the highest number of registrations in the clubs history.

The "early-bird" offer was used again, encouraging people to register early. This allowed us adequate time to prepare registration packs prior to the season start.

With the increase in registration numbers, registration was closed at the end of August once numbers exceeded 500, and a waitlist was started for committee to review.

This season, our centre continued to offer a Tiny Tots age group for athletes turning 5 years old in 2025. This group was targeted at younger siblings of registered athletes and was open to new families.

This year our centre retained just over half of our athletes from last season. The season retention rate was slightly lower than last season. We did increase our number of new registrations (243 new athletes this season compared to 171 new athletes in 2023/24).

A new registration platform, RevSport, was introduced this season with athletes needing to obtain a National ID number prior to registering with our club. We also had the introduction of a separate 16's age group, previously athletes spent 2 seasons in the 17's age group.

We thank the committee for their efforts in helping on our registration nights, they could never be run by one person alone. We greatly appreciated all the help and support from all committee members. Another great team effort this season.

Registrations for the 2025/26 season should reopen online from August of this year. Please keep an eye out for registration information around this time.

Another successful Championships done and dusted, with some amazing results from our wonderful athletes.

#### State Relays 8's - 12's

This was our first championships of the year, kids were ready to go. I think this is a favourite event because the athletes get to compete in teams. We had 15 teams: 10 field teams and 5 track teams. #### Southern Met Zone Championships

#### Region 8 Championships

#### State Track & Field Championships

State Championships saw a very different format this year, 9's-12's and 13's-20's, it took a minute to get our heads around everything but in true form our athletes just bounced and did what they had to do.

#### 9's - 12's Sydney Olympic Park Athletics Track

We had 15 athletes qualify for state, this pathway was one where each athlete had to compete at Zone and Region to qualify for State, a huge achievement to continuously progress through the stages. We had 4 athletes from the 9 Girls qualify for state for the first time, 5 athletes who represented for the first time as older athletes and 6 athletes with previous representation at State. This was exciting times for these athletes, big stadium, great atmosphere and tough competition. We had amazing results from every athlete, we had huge PB's, lots of placings and 3 medals. Congratulations to Jordyn Brookes who won Silver in the 9 Girls Discus and Bronze in Shot Put, and Josh Wallis who won Bronze in the 12 Boys 1500m Race Walk.

Our athletes all placed in the top 25 in the state, that achievement is huge, these kids should be very proud of their results.

#### 13's - 20's Juniors Sydney Olympic Park Athletics Track

It is based on a points system taking into account participation and results from Zone through to State competitions as well as Centre records for the current season. The three leading point scorers are nominated for this award and the awards sub-committee votes on the nominations.

Jordyn has had an incredible season and her achievements this season are remarkable for someone her age.

In the first championships of the season, the Little Athletics State Relays, Jordyn was a member of the 9 Girls Throws team, who secured themselves a Gold medal for their combined performances in Discus and Shot Put. A few months later, Jordyn entered 4 events at the Zone Championships and achieved 1st place in Shot Put, 2nd place in Discus and 2nd place in 700m Race Walk. At the Region Championships, Jordyn achieved 1st place in Discus, 3rd place in Shot Put and 6th place in the Walk. Jordyn also broke the Region record in Discus, which had stood for 22 years!


